Language and Heresy in Ismaili Thought: The Kitab al-Zina of Abu Hatim al-Razi. Gorgias Press, January, 2009. Publication of doctoral dissertation, which entails a detailed study of Kitab al-Zina by the Ismaili preacher Abu Hatim al-Razi, and sheds light on certain aspects of the state of the linguistic sciences during the end of the third and beginning of the fourth centuries A.H., such as grammar and lexicography.

Co-author of *Arabi Liblib*, a textbook and reference work on idiomatic expressions and terms of description in colloquial Egyptian Arabic, written in collaboration with Kamal AlEkhrawy, an instructor in Arabic at the American University in Cairo. This Book is targeted at advanced learners of Egyptian Arabic and includes explanations in Arabic and translation of idioms and expressions English, as well as exercises for reinforcement.
