A complete application must include the following:

- ◆ The four page application including: Application/Registration form, course selection form indicating four choices in order of preference; parent consent form, and media consent form (if 18 yrs or older)
- ◆ Copy of PSAT and/or SAT score report
- ◆ Copy of high school transcript indicating Regents scores

You must submit all documents even if you have already taken a course with College Now. Each student will only be enrolled in one course per semester.

December 11 th	Deadline: Applications will be reviewed on this date
December 23 rd	Notification letters mailed to applicants
January 15 th	Deadline for students to RSVP via email; Students who do not RSVP by this date will be dropped from the program, NO EXCEPTIONS!
January 19 th , 20 th , & 21 st	Orientation categorized by class
January 28 th	First day of spring semester classes (only students taking classes on Thursdays start this day; M/W students start 2/1/10 and Saturday students start 1/30/10)

- All students must RSVP to confirm their participation in the College Now program by the established deadline. The College Now program at Hunter reserves the right to drop students who do not submit their RSVP on time.
- Students are required to attend assigned orientation sessions. Students who fail to do so will be dropped from the program.
- Attendance policies for program courses will be enforced to ensure success.
- Students who drop or withdraw from the program will be required to return class text books and Hunter ID. Students who fail to return College Now property could be charged the full amount of the item.

(Descriptions of each course on back or on next page if not double-sided)

◆ **Dance 252.99:** Fundamentals of West African (2 credits)

Description: The two credit course, Fundamentals of West African dance, is an advanced beginning college level West African class taught by Hunter faculty members. This course is open to anyone interested in dance. A dance background is not required.

◆ **Theatre 161:** Acting I: Basic Acting Techniques (3 credits)

Description: Exploration of the Fundamentals of acting technique through improvisation.

◆ **English 120:** Expository Writing (3 credits)

Description: Introduction to documented research. Trains students to analyze, develop, and evaluate ideas, and to express themselves clearly and effectively.

◆ **Italian 101:** Elementary Italian I (3 credits)

Description: Introduction to Italian language and culture. In addition to scheduled class time, students are also required to meet a language lab minimum of 28 hours per semester. Student should allot extra time in their schedule for this mandatory component.

◆ **Music Theory 101:** Basic Musicianship (3 credits)

Description: A traditional course in the rudiments of music, designed for students with little or no prior training in music theory. The fundamentals of music and music notation are covered, including pitches, rhythms, meters, scales, key signatures, intervals, and basic chords. Students develop fluency through written assignments and practical application.

◆ **Political Science 110:** American Government: A Historical Introduction (3 credits)

Description: Overview of the American political system from a historical perspective, with emphasis on the Constitution and its enduring influence, development of party systems and citizen participation and evolving role of Congress, presidency and courts.

◆ **Psychology 100:** Introduction to Psychology (3 credits)

Description: An introduction to the problems, methods and concepts of psychology, covering a range of topics which characterize the discipline, including history, methodology and professional ethics, biological foundations, perception, motivation and emotion, learning, memory and thinking, individual differences, intelligence, personality, behavior disorders and their treatment, and group processes.

◆ **Sociology 101:** Introduction to Sociology (3 credits)

Description: Development of sociological imagination through introduction and application of basic concepts incorporating global and comparative perspectives.

◆ **Statistics 113:** Elementary Probability and Statistics (3 credits)

Description: Discrete probability; descriptive, inferential statistics. Estimation and hypothesis testing for normal and binomial means.
