

Reading and Posting in Discussion Boards


Overview

Discussion boards are online spaces that can extend communication beyond the confines of the classroom. Discussion boards in Blackboard are composed of two items—**forums** and **threads**. **Forums** are areas that include one or more threads related to a theme. Only instructors can create discussion forums. Students and instructors can participate in discussions, by replying to posts or creating new threads (if the instructor has made that option available to students). This document contains step-by-step instructions for reading and posting messages on discussion boards.

Note: The screen shots in this document correspond to the student view of the discussion board. Instructors have additional options that are not shown or discussed in this document.

Reading a Discussion Board Post

1. Click on **Discussion Board** on the course navigation menu. (If you do not see **Discussion Board**, then click on **Communication** and then on **Discussion Board**.)
2. Click on the name of the forum you wish to read.

- Once you are in a forum, you will see that there are two ways to view the threads in the forum: **List View** and **Tree View**. You can choose which way you prefer to view threads by default. **List View** displays a list of all threads. The total number of posts in each thread is displayed in the **Total Posts** column. Threads containing an unread post appear in boldface.

Tree View gives you a visual indication of which threads have responses. You can click on the + sign to the left of the thread title to see the entire structure of a thread, including responses and responses to responses. A post that is indented is a response to a previous post.

- To view the content of a thread or post, click on its title. In the top box, you will see the structure of the thread. A post that you have not read yet appears in boldface. In the bottom box, you will see the text of the post.



Posting to a Discussion Board

There are two ways to participate in discussion boards. You can write a reply to a post or you can start a new thread, if the instructor has made that option available.

To reply to a post, follow the instructions below:

1. View the post to which you want to reply and click on the **Reply** button.







Subscribing to a Forum

One way to help you stay abreast of new posts in discussion boards is by subscribing to a forum. If your instructor has enabled the subscription feature, then you may subscribe to a forum to receive email notifications when a new post has been added. Depending on the setting that your instructor has chosen, the email message can contain either the complete text of the new post or only a link to it. If the email only includes a link, clicking on it will direct you to the **CUNY Portal** so that you can log into Blackboard and view the post in its context. If you are already logged in to Blackboard, the link will lead directly to the actual post in the **Discussion Board**.

To **subscribe to a forum**, follow the instructions below:

1. Click on the name of the forum you wish to subscribe to.



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

2. Click on the **Subscribe** button on the tool bar. From now on, you will receive an email every time a new post is added to this forum.
