MASTER'S PROGRAM: COMMUNITY/PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

The Hunter College, School of Nursing of the City University of New York offers a 42-credit <u>hybrid</u> program for advanced public health nurses, leading to a Master of Science degree. This program prepares nurses who can assume leadership roles in community and population health in a variety of settings, including community-based programs, clinics and public health agencies. Students learn to apply advanced knowledge and research findings to practice through coursework and 501 hours of supervised clinical experience.

The program consists of core and public health courses taken with other graduate students in nursing, specialization and clinical courses and one elective course. The elective may be chosen from any graduate program at Hunter College.
