	Working one-on-one with faculty thesis advisor, students receive guidance on the substantive dimensions of their projects (which are also the focus of work in Polsc 493); and advice on the final product: a prospectus of research & writing activities to be pursued in Semester 2 (in Polsc 492).	Continuing work with thesis advisor, students are guided toward completion of their projects, including preparation of draft & final thesis document and development of visual & oral presentation for department-wide student research-exchange event.

NOTES:

- To register for Polsc 491, 492, and 493, students must obtain consent in writing from the proposed thesis advisor, who must be a <u>full-time member of the political science</u> faculty. This should be arranged during the semester <u>before</u> 491 and 493 will be taken.
- The best way to locate a suitable thesis advisor is to take 200- or 300- level courses with full-time faculty teaching on topics of potential interest. (Three 300-level courses are required for the major.)
- The same faculty member will ordinarily serve as advisor for both Polsc 491 and 492, though arrangements can be made when a student's break in study, or a faculty member's research leave, makes such continuity impractical.
- Consult department website for faculty consent forms, lists containing other requirements for graduation with honors (minimum GPA, etc.), and details regarding thesis deadlines, submission process, and presentation event.
