☐ Between 2009 and 2013, 72% of Barnard applicants were accepted to medical school. Students with GPA's of 3.5 or higher were accepted at rates of about 80%.

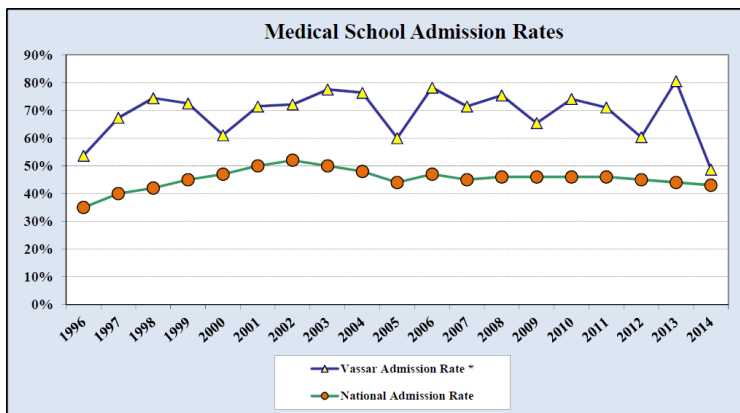
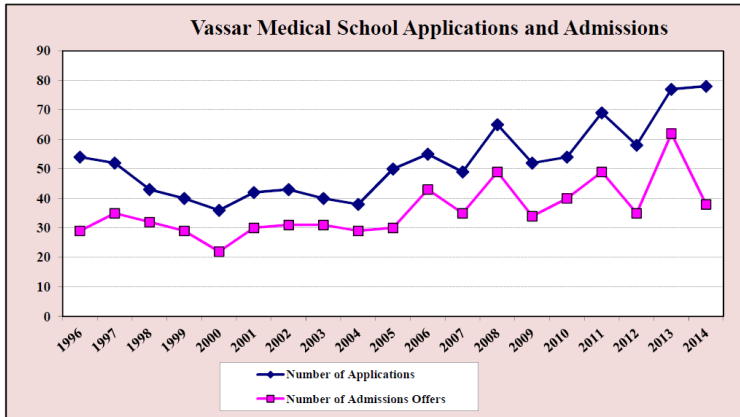
