ATTENTION QUEST APPLICANTS

Transfer student applicants must have a copy of their transcripts sent to the QUEST coordinator. Your application will not be evaluated until all transcripts from previously attended colleges have been received by the School of Education.

Students who do not meet the following admissions requirements should speak with the QUEST coordinator before submitting this application:

- 1. Complete at least 30 credits toward the Bachelor's degree. Students with more than 72 credits should consider pursuing Childhood Education at the graduate level.**
- 2. Attain a Hunter College Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.8 or better.**
- 3. Pass the COMPASS exam or Math 101.**
- 4. Receive a grade of B or better in ENGL 120.**
- 5. Have no more than 6 cr. of CR/NC grades.**
- 6. Transfer students will have to complete 12 credits of coursework at Hunter College before applying. *However, transfer students with 60 or more credits and GPA's of 3.3 or better may be immediately considered for admission.***

If you have not yet taken the COMPASS exam or passed Math 101, please go to the Testing Office (North 150) to sign up for the next scheduled COMPASS exam. You may also call (212)772-4920 for details about testing.

Students are encouraged to complete as many of the Required Liberal Arts & Sciences General Core as possible before applying to the program. Not having these all completed will not necessarily weaken your application, but the courses listed below are required for all QUEST students, and constitute several of the pre-requisites for courses in the program:

- English 220**
- History 151 and 152**
- Geography 101**
- Two semesters of science; one course must have a lab***
- Two courses in the arts**
- Math 104 and 105 (for QUEST students only)**

***Computer Science does not count as a science course in meeting this requirement.**

Those who are accepted must officially declare QUEST as a second major. QUEST students must also declare a first major in the School of Arts & Sciences. Since the choice of a first major is restricted to subjects directly related to the critical subject areas in the elementary school curriculum, QUEST students are required to choose one of the following majors:

- English**
- English Language Arts**
- Mathematics**
- Biology**
- Chemistry**
- History**
- Geography**
- Social Studies**
