UNDERGRADUATE COURSE OF STUDY COMMITTEE deals with policy for distribution requirements, new major/minor programs, course credits, major/minor concentrations, degree requirements, interdisciplinary programs, new courses, etc.

5 students, 7 faculty

UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS COMMITTEE formulates policy regarding methods of grading, admissions, attendance, withdrawal, and maintenance of academic standards.

5 students, 7 faculty

GRADUATE COURSE OF STUDY & ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS COMMITTEE reviews all masters programs, graduate course proposals and graduate curriculum changes; formulates policy regarding methods of grading, admissions, attendance, withdrawal, maintenance of academic standards and accreditation of work done at other institutions.

5 students, 6 faculty

STUDENT STANDING COMMITTEE (faculty only) is responsible for the evaluation of student records, for recommending the award of degrees, and for formulating policy on the retention of students and the maintenance of academic standards.

5 faculty

COMMITTEE ON EVALUATION OF TEACHING is responsible for preparation of standard guides for evaluation questionnaires, ongoing review of questionnaires in actual use, analysis and publication of data drawn from questionnaires.

7 students, 5 faculty

COMMITTEE ON THE BUDGET reviews the consolidated annual college budget; advises President on apportionment of instructional budget, resources, and space.

6 students, 6 faculty, 1 chair

GRADE APPEALS COMMITTEE makes final grade appeals decisions and establishes procedural guidelines.

3 students, 4 faculty

GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT APPEALS COMMITTEE makes final decisions on student appeals.

2 students, 5 faculty

MASTER PLAN COMMITTEE plans general college development; considers priorities affecting long-term projections for programs and facilities.

5 students, 5 faculty, 1 chair

DEPARTMENTAL GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE recommends standards for departmental by-laws and revisions proposed by departments, and investigates alleged infractions of such by-laws.

5 students, 5 faculty, 1 administrator

COMMITTEE ON THE LIBRARY functions in advisory capacity to the Chief Librarian, and as a liaison between the Library and the college community; reviews immediate and long-term needs of the Library and library needs of individual departments and disciplines.

7 students, 7 faculty, 2 Librarians

COMMITTEE ON THE CALENDAR is responsible for preparing the college calendar and bell schedule.

6 students, 6 faculty

NOMINATING COMMITTEE recommends candidates for membership on Senate Committees.

4 students, 4 faculty, 1 chair

CHARTER REVIEW COMMITTEE reviews the composition, structure, and function of the Hunter College Senate and recommends Charter amendments.

5 students, 5 faculty, 1 administrator, 1 chair

COMPUTING & TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE proposes and reviews computing technology plans and strategies as they impact on the instructional, research, and administrative functions at the College.

8 faculty, 2 Staff, 1 student

EVENING COUNCIL develops and recommends to the president required improvements in the supporting services during evening hours; identifies, reviews, and gives focus to matters of interest to evening students and faculty.

8 students, 8 faculty, 1 chair

SELECT COMMITTEE ON THE FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE reviews existing academic and support programs to improve the academic experience of first year students.

4 faculty, 4 Student Services staff, 5 students

SELECT COMMITTEE ON PERFORMANCE MEASURES & OUTCOMES ASSESSMENT reviews current practices and proposes alternate measures.

7 faculty, 4 students
