

## AC Working Doc: existing faculty governance structures for academic programming

Where academic programming is curricula that may be used for credit to fulfill graduation requirements, and prerequisites and requirements of minor, certificate, major, or degree programs.

1. Dept programming: major, minor tracks that may bring in courses from other depts (e.g. Women & Gender Studies, Biology major tracks)	Department Chair	Dept P&B, Curriculum and Policy Committees, and Department's voting members	CUNY Bylaws, HC Gov Charter, Department Bylaws
2. Intra-departmental programming (e.g. Classical Studies)	Dept "divisional" head or coordinator who is faculty member of department	Within department	CUNY Bylaws, HC Gov Charter, Department Bylaws
3. Inter-departmental programming between departments (or divisions) (with or w/out faculty advisory group of departmental reps) (e.g. Political Theory Minor, English Adolescent Ed. BA)	Dept Chairs (or designated members) working cooperatively, or a Director who is a faculty member with appointment in participating dept	Dept P&B and Dept (or Divisional) Curriculum Committees working cooperatively	In original program proposal*
<b>Non-departmentally run academic programming (inter- or multi-disciplinary)* (object of Resolutions)</b>			
4. Controlled by a faculty governance committee (GC) whose membership is tied to specific depts (e.g. Human Biology)	Director is faculty member (usually tenured), with appointment in participating dept, who chairs Faculty GC	Faculty GC, and Dept curriculum and P&B committees for departmentally controlled offerings in unit's required curriculum	In originating curriculum proposal that also established governance unit
5. Controlled by faculty GC whose membership is <u>not</u> essentially tied to specific departments (e.g. Asian American Studies, THHP)	Director (usually tenured) who chairs Faculty GC	Faculty GC	In originating curriculum proposal that also established governance unit
6. Controlled by a faculty unit of affiliated faculty that elects its faculty GC; membership in unit not tied to specific depts (e.g. Human Rights)	Split: Faculty Chair of Faculty GC & Director for day-to-day administrative duties.	Faculty GC	In originating curriculum proposal that also established governance unit
