

**MINUTES**

**12 December 2001**

- 1 The 408<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Hunter College Senate was convened at 4:05 PM in Room W714.  
2  
3 **Presiding:** Alan Hausman, Chair  
4  
5 **Attendance:** The elected members of the Senate with the exception of those listed in Appendix I.

7 **Agenda:** The agenda was adopted as distributed.

9 **Report by the** The Chair informed the Senate that the President had agreed to postpone discussion of

11 **President:** Goals to the Special meeting scheduled for December 19<sup>th</sup>.

13 **Report by the** The Chair led the Senate in a moment of silence in memory of Professor Al Bennick, who had  
14 **Administrative** been a member of the Senate from its inception until his retirement from the Department of  
15 **Committee:** Physics & Astronomy at Hunter.

17 **Approved Curriculum Changes**  
18 The following curriculum changes as listed in Part I and II of the report dated 12 December  
19 2001 were approved as per Senate resolution and were submitted for the Senate's information:  
20 Items US-1220 (Chemistry), UE-1207E (Classics/Russian), US-1214A (Political Science),  
21 US-1222A (Biological Sciences), GS-555 (Education-ASAP), GS-556 (C&T/Educational  
22 Foundations), GS-559 (Education-TESOL), GS-560 (Educational Foundations), GS-561, 562,  
23 and 563 (Special Education).  
24  
25 **Items Carried** **Continuation of UCSC Report Re: General Education Requirement**  
26 **Over:** Professor Hausman, on behalf of the Committee, presented the revised report dated 12 Decem-  
27 ber 2001.  
28  
29 The motion on the floor was the following change in the description to Stage 3: Focused Expo-  
30 sure:  
31  
32 **FROM:**  
33 Resolved, that a new "Group C Foreign Literature read in the original" be added to Stage  
34 3; and that the description for Stage 3 be changed to read as follows:  
35  
36 **TO:**  
37 **BE IT RESOLVED**, that a course without a W designation may be included in Stage 3:  
38 Focused Exposure in either Group A or B. It is expected (or strongly recommended) that  
39 students will have taken a first course in that discipline; and  
40  
41 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Group C, Foreign Literature read in the original, be  
42 eliminated; and  
43  
44 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the description for Stage 3 Focused Exposure be  
45 changed to read as follows:

51 "These courses are intended to give students the opportunity to study selected subjects  
52 outside their major in greater depth than in Stage 2. Usually, these courses will be  
53 beyond the 100 level. Accordingly, it is strongly recommended that students take a  
54 first course in the same discipline. A student must take at least two courses in Stage 3.  
55 At least one of these must have a "W" designation. (Note: Some Stage 3 courses  
56 may not have a "W" designation.)"  
57

58 After extensive discussion it was moved that the motion be amended by deleting the "Note" in  
59 the description for Stage 3: Focused Exposure, and by adding the following sentence to the  
60 description:

61  
62 "All courses in Groups A and B must have a "W" designation to indicate that they include  
63 significant writing, unless they are foreign literature courses read in the original."  
64

65 (If approved this would also eliminate the first "Be it resolved.")  
66

67 After discussion the question on the motion to amend was called and carried. The motion to  
68 amend was approved by hand vote and became part of the main motion on the floor.  
69

70 The motion on the floor was the main motion as amended.  
71

72 After discussion the question was called and carried. The motion, as amended, was approved  
73 by hand vote.


75 Resolution # 3 to change the "Regulations" of the GER was on the floor.
