Committee Reports: <u>UARC Report re: Minimum GPA for Graduation with General College Honors</u>

Professor Jason Young, Chair of the Committee, presented the following resolution for Senate approval:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the minimum GPA for Graduating with General College Honors be raised to 3.5 for Cum Laude, 3.75 for Magna Cum Laude, and 3.9 for Summa Cum Laude, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this policy shall go into effect with the graduating class of January 2000; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Undergraduate Catalog be changed as follows:

Graduation with General College Honors. A student who has completed 60 credits of traditional letter grades at Hunter College may be considered for graduation honors. Students with a cumulative GPA of 3.800 or higher will be graduated Summa Cum Laude. Students with a GPA from 3.600 to 3.799 will be graduated Magna Cum Laude. Students with a GPA from 3.250 to 3.599 will be graduated Cum Laude.

TO:

Graduation with General College Honors. A student who has completed 60 credits of traditional letter grades at Hunter College may be considered for graduation honors. Students with a cumulative GPA of 3.900 or higher will be graduated Summa Cum Laude. Students with a GPA from 3.750 to 3.899 will be graduated Magna Cum Laude. Students with a GPA from 3.500 to 3.749 will be graduated Cum Laude.

The resolution was unanimously approved by hand vote.

UARC Report re: Procedures for Withdrawing from Courses that Result in a W Grade

Professor Young presented the following report for Senate approval:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the procedure for withdrawal from courses up to the 10th week of classes be modified as follows:

- that the withdrawal form be revised to require students to obtain the instructor's signature (to signify that the instructor has been informed of the student's intent to withdraw), and
- that for informational purposes only the withdrawal form be further revised to include check-off boxes indicating the reason for withdrawal from class (i.e. personal, medical, academic), and check-off boxes that indicate the student's academic status in the course at the time of the withdrawal request; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Undergraduate Academic Requirements Committee be mandated to review the current policy of withdrawal from classes in the Fall 2000 semester, using the data collected.

This resolution shall go into effect in Fall 1999.

After discussion it was moved that the question on paragraphs "a" and "b" be divided. The motion carried.

The motion on the floor was approval of paragraph "a".

After discussion the question was called and carried. Paragraph "a" was approved by hand vote.
