

Regular Meeting of The Hunter College Senate

May 17, 1971

	The sixth meeting of The Hunter College Senate was convened at 6:50 p.m. in the High School Auditorium on May 17, 1971.	1. 2.																								
Presiding:	Louis Massa, Chairman	3.																								
Attendance:	The elected members of the Senate with the exception of those noted by the Secretary and listed in Appendix I. Total attendance <u>135</u> .	4. 5. 6.																								
Minutes:	The minutes of the fifth meeting approved without dissent.	7.																								
Report of Administrative Committee:	Professor Charles Sherover presented the Administrative Committee's report. The first item in the report was a schedule of meetings for the coming year. Professor Sherover moved adoption of a schedule setting each meeting at 5:30 p.m. on every fourth Thursday. He explained that President Wexler would instruct the Registrar to give priority to each Senate member to allow him to change his schedule to conform with the Senate calendar. During discussion Professor Korn suggested that a new schedule be prepared providing rotating days with Monday as the first day, Tuesday as the second, etc. and two alternating starting times, the first Monday meeting to be held at 4 p.m. and the second Monday meeting to be held at 5:30 p.m. and so on through the entire ten meetings. Professor Sherover then reported that the Resolution regarding the budget crisis adopted at the Fifth meeting was forwarded to the press, Governor Rockefeller and the Majority and Minority Leaders of the State Assembly and State Senate as mandated. Professor Sherover then reported, with reference to the Ombudsman's salary, that should a faculty member be elected to the position he would retain his present salary status. If a student should win the election, the President would place a floor of \$6,500, the final salary to be negotiable in the light of the individual's qualifications. It was moved that the Senate recommend to the President the salary for Ombudsman. Carried by hand vote. Professor Koser then moved that the Ombudsman have the same salary no matter what his rank and that his salary should be fixed at the average faculty salary should a student be elected, and that it not be less than what would be the current salary of the individual whether he be a faculty member or student. A substitute motion was made to table the motion until the Ombudsman is elected. Carried by hand vote. Professor Sherover, reporting for the Administrative Committee, moved rules for election of Ombudsman as mandated by the Governance Charter that the number of people voting shall be defined as the number of paper ballots submitted on each separate ballot count. Ombudsman Election:	The Chair then turned the floor over to Pansy Mullings, Chairman of the Nominations Committee. Miss Mullings explained that ballots would be counted by four groups designated by the Nominations Committee, each group consisting of four individuals with two people reading the ballots and two people noting the results. Miss Mullings then informed the Senate that from the 15 names nominated the following had withdrawn: Peter Demby, William Shanahan, Venus Green, and Arlene Amidon. Fred Brandes was declared ineligible to run as per the Governance Charter, by the Nominations Committee, on the grounds that he is not a member of the Hunter College Community. It was moved that nominees be allowed to speak before the Senate before elections were begun. Defeated by voice vote. Miss Mullings proceeded to hand out the ballots.
