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19 November 2014 174 175 **Report by** Eamon Pickard, Vice Chair of the Senate, said the following: **Student Caucus:** 176 177 "Last week, the Student Caucus met with the Undergraduate Student Government (USG) and the 178 Chair of the Charter Review Committee. We discussed connecting the USG and Student Caucus 179 so that we can find the student voice. There is a value in the students being able to voice their 180 opinions about the school. We think that this team work will increase the value of the student's 181 voice. We also discussed the possibility of some joint legislation. In the future, we are expecting to meet with the President of the USG and the chair of their Senate. We talked about re-182 183 implementing an independent study course for student Senators. Back in the day, student Senators could sign up for an independent study course where they would work with the Hunter College 184 185 Senate. They would have a stronger commitment and incentive. We will examine this incentive. We also want to implement an intake committee that would manage applications for the students 186 interested in taking the independent study. Current incentives for student Senators include priority 187 registration. On December 1st, we will be tabling on several floor for students. Thank you very 188 much " 189 190 191 192 **Report on** Alex Rosero and Aliya Frazier from Student Affairs presented the report. 193 **Student Veteran** 194 Services "My name is Aliya Frazier and I am an Associate Director in Advising Services. I wanted to start 195 by giving you a little history on Veteran Services here at Hunter. I started here in Fall 2008, and 196 that's when we formally established Student Veteran Services. Prior to that, Veteran Services was 197 split. Registrar's Office did the certifications and managed the communications with veteran 198 administrations. Advising managed the communication with the student. We didn't have one hub 199 to assist veterans. Our initial set up was to have two advisors that would manage veterans case 200

loads. This was just part of our job. We established institutional support systems and figure out what was the educational and medical benefits for our students. In term of programing, that's what we really focused on. We have a coordinated effort between Student Veteran Services and other areas of interest. We help our service members transition to students by providing academic and personal support and by establish points of contact. We take our student veteran population seriously and find way to continually enhance Student Veteran Services. Because of that, we created our academic advisor for veterans."

Alex Rosero said the following:

"We provide a 360 degree approach to the support services we provide veterans. We do that looking at the institutional and academic support systems and personal support systems and establishing point of contact throughout the college. When a student veteran matriculates, they normally need to attend a general orientation. In additional to that, we invite them to a one-on-one to inform them of all the services the college provides. Two biggest benefits that the school provides is priority registration and tuition deferral. We give them until the end of the semester to pay their tuition. The student doesn't have the financial stress to worry about.

It's really important that the transition is as seamless as possible. We have established dedicated contacts that will help them transition.

In terms of demographics and statistics, we have 210 matriculated, degree seeking students. 162 are undergraduates, so about 75% of out student veterans are pursuing a BA degree. Regarding male and female, it's a 56%/44% split. The average age of our undergraduate student veteran population is 31. In terms of GPA, the average is 3.0."

Aliya Frazier returned to the podium and said the following:

"One of the things that is very important for student veterans is to have a dedicated space. We use to be under the stairs in the east building. We have moved to C118North. The Student Veteran Recourse Center provides free access to computers and printers. The space fits comfortable
