



State Child Abuse Registries

The Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act requires states to "check any child abuse and neglect registry maintained by the State for information on any prospective foster or adoptive parent and on any other adult living in the home of such a prospective parent, and request any other State in which any such prospective parent or other adult has resided in the preceding 5 years, to enable the State to check any child abuse and neglect registry maintained by such other State for such information, before the prospective foster or adoptive parent may be finally approved for placement of a child" and to "comply with any request described...(above) that is received from another State."

The request shall also cite the criminal penalties for unlawful disclosure of any information provided by the requesting state or the applicable interstate compact provision. In the absence of an out-of-state statute or interstate compact provision that requires that the information shall be used for no

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			purpose other than conducting background checks in foster or adoptive cases and criminal penalties equivalent to the penalties in California for unlawful disclosure, access shall be denied.

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			<p>(http://www.aoc.state.nc.us/www/public/coa/opinions/2010/pdf/090205-1.pdf) finding that the statutes governing the procedures used to release child abuse and neglect information for the purpose of approving prospective foster/adoptive parents or employee/volunteer applicants, violated the North Carolina Constitution. Therefore, access to child abuse and neglect information has been suspended and NC is unable to comply with any request for information. We are aware of the concerns that this action raises for the safety of children and agencies are encouraged to ensure that information gathered regarding a prospective employee/volunteer or a foster or adoptive applicant is thorough and that all available resources are utilized to determine the fitness of the individual to provide care to a child.
