SELECTION CRITERIA

All applications will be reviewed by a Selection Committee of community leaders and community development practitioners. Applicants will be interviewed either by phone or in person during the first week of October, and will be notified about their participation by Friday October 8, 2010.

Applicants will be reviewed for the Fellowship based on the following criteria:

- High school degree or GED in the last 5 years and/or current undergraduate student
- Quality and content of responses to the short essays
- Quality of the selection interview
- Commitment to community development work
- Ability to speak an Asian language (preferred but not required)

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

All interested applicants are required to submit **(1) the Application Form** and **(2) a Resume *no later than September 24, 2010, at 5 PM.***

Applicants can submit their application materials via email to douglas_le@aafe.org. Be sure to save the 2010 Application Form as a new file on your local computer, and submit it as an attachment. The resume should be in PDF (.pdf) or Word Document (.doc or .docx) format, and submitted with the 2010 Application Form.
