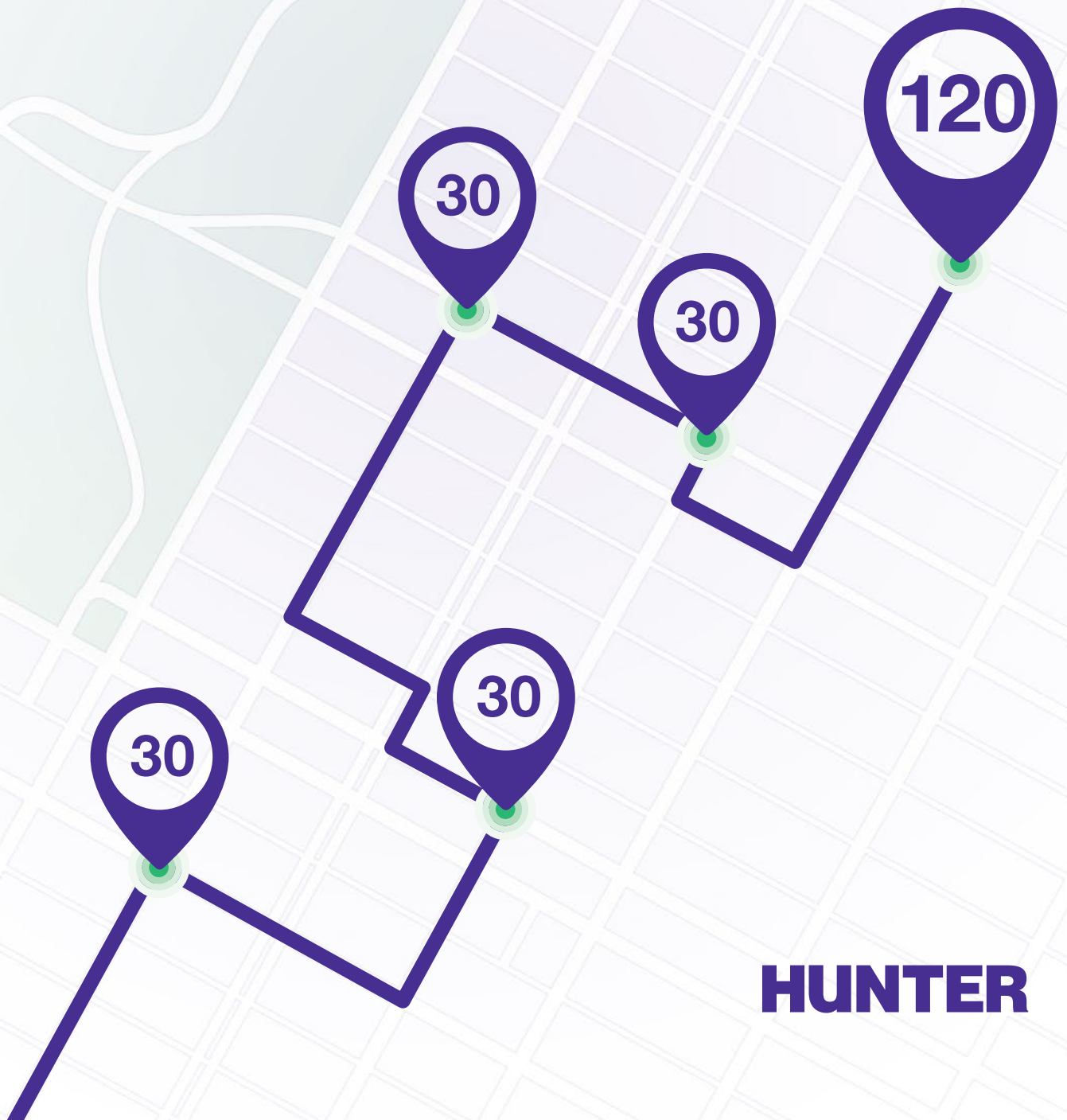

•Students interested in Study Abroad should speak with a departmental advisor about the German Department’s summer program in Kassel, Germany. This program carries a total of 6 credit hours, 3 that may be applied to the major and 3 that will count as elective credits.

•Students who complete the intensive language sequence (German 103 and 203) in their first year may move on to Advanced Language and Literature courses (German 301-302, 310, 320-339) in their sophomore year.

•At least 12 credits must be earned by taking advanced classes in German literature and culture (numbered 320-359; also 444). Three or more of these credits must be from level 2 literature courses (numbered 340-359; also 444). Majors are permitted to substitute one level 1 literature course (numbered 230-339) with a level 2 language course (numbered 381-385). Students are encouraged to consult a departmental advisor as early as possible to plan their course of studies in German.
