

<sup>•</sup>Students interested in Study Abroad should speak with a departmental advisor about the German Department's summer program in Kassel, Germany. This program carries a total of 6 credit hours, 3 that may be applied to the major and 3 that will count as elective credits.

<sup>•</sup>Students who complete the intensive language sequence (German 103 and 203) in their first year may move on to Advanced Language and Literature courses (German 301-302, 310, 320-339) in their sophomore year.

<sup>•</sup>At least 12 credits must be earned by taking advanced classes in German literature and culture (numbered 320-359; also 444). Three or more of these credits must be from level 2 literature courses 9numbered 340-359; also 444). Majors are permitted to substitute one level 1 literature course (numbered 230-339) with a level 2 language course (numbered 381-385). Students are encouraged to consult a departmental advisor as early as possible to plan their course of studies in German.
