STAFFING & STUDENT SUPPORT

- The Academic Coordinator (AC) will handle all academic issues. The AC and full-time faculty will be
 academic advisors for students and hold office hours and monthly meetings.
- The Student Affairs Coordinator will handle admissions, visas, Taiwan's Alien Registration Card, exchange activities between different universities, and students' emergency contacts.
- The Student Life Coordinator will help students adapt to life in Taiwan, keep track of students' attendance, accompany students for medical check-ups, and handle emergency requests in English.
- The Internship Coordinator will handle all aspects of the internships.
- The Student Housing Coordinator will handle on-campus housing, health checks required by the host institution, and the national health insurance requirement.
- The Off-campus Housing & Activities Coordinator will handle off-campus accommodations, cultural trips, and language partner and host family programs.
- NCCU's Physical & Mental Health Center provides counseling services in English.

COURSEWORK

Class placement will be based on the pre-capstone test scores at the time of application. The teaching methods and learning materials used will be tailored to students' proficiency levels. Taiwan Center courses will be taught by Taiwan Center teachers:

First Semester: CHIN 40105 - Intercultural Communication in Greater China (3 credits)

CHIN 40108 - Domain Research in Chinese (3 credits) CHIN 40109 - Chinese for Professional Purposes (3 credits)

Second Semester: CHIN 49806 - In-service Internship (6 credits)

CHIN 40106 - Media in Contemporary Chinese Societies (3 credits) CHIN 40113 - Social and Political Affairs Studies in Chinese (3 credits)

INTERNSHIP

- Students submit their Chinese resume & bio to the US office by August 1, 2023.
- Internship Coordinator assists students in applying for internships in September, 2023.
- Students secure their internship positions in October, 2023.
- One day of internship preparation workshops will be offered in February, 2024.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Students will take part in various cultural activities, such as field trips to sites in Taipei, cooking lessons on Taiwanese culinary specialties, overnight cultural trips to learn about indigenous culture, Taiwanese art, food, history, music, religion, etc.
