

Notes:

1. Chinese Christian fellowship: event was scheduled for June 15, 2012 but club agreed to change the date to the first week of June instead.
2. Students for Justice in Palestine: club officers were not present; club will receive 75% reimbursement due to events being held before its approval by the CA.
3. GEO: approval pending conversation with Nicole and Teneia regarding trip occurring outside of Hunter and after the extension appeal deadline.
4. Crimson & Cream: speakers cannot receive gifts. They are to be given only honorariums.
5. Epsilon Sigma Phi: note to use term “members” instead of “girls” in language. Hunter clubs must allow membership to all students irrespective of gender.
6. Hillel: events held in April will be reimbursed 75% due to not having it approved first.
7. American Medical Student Association: \$300 should remain in line 5.

8. Blue & White Society: some gifts were given to non-Hunter members of the club. Club will receive reimbursements only for Hunter students. Club was advised to speak with ICIT as soon as possible as they included interest in purchasing computers.
9. Gay Men's Alliance & Lesbians Rising: both clubs are joining to purchase furniture for their room which must go through facilities first. Club officers were advised to speak with Nicole to obtain list of approved vendors.
10. Pre-Dental Society: tabled until further information is shared with Teneia. Their income earned budget stated they earned \$51 from their Cookies for Cancer Bake Sale which they would like to donate to the oral cancer foundation.
11. Club India: club would like to hold an event on a boat. Club officers were instructed to send Eunice and Teneia further information regarding the boat company. They will then determine approval. The club's furniture request needs to go to approved vendors. Club officers were also instructed to speak with Nicole on this matter.
12. Alpha Phi Omega: club officers were instructed to send list of club members who received stoles for graduation to confirm they are Hunter students.
