RECOMMENDED COURSE OF STUDY: In addition to taking ENGL 252 no later than the first semester after declaring the major, the English Department strongly recommends that English Language Arts students take ENGL 301, ENGL 280 (formerly 331), ENGL 304 (formerly 338), and ENGL 307 (formerly 395), 396 or 397 in their first two semesters as majors. If you choose to take fewer than three English courses per semester, as many students do, it is still important to take ENGL 301 and 280 (formerly 331) early in your course of study.
