The report as amended and approved reads as follows:	76	
WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of CUNY has authorized Hunter College to grant degrees to students upon completion of prescribed Hunter College academic requirements; and	77 78 79	
WHEREAS, the integrity of the Hunter College degree is dependent upon the establishment and maintenance of educational requirements by the College; and	80 81	
WHEREAS, such standards include general Distribution Requirements mandated for all students as well as requirements for major concentrations established and monitored in individual Departments and Programs; and	82 83 84	
WHEREAS, the Board policy statement of November 27, 1972 concerning the transfer of credits from Community Colleges to Senior Colleges states that "the mandated acceptance of 64 credits is not intended to restrict the senior colleges from the establishment of major requirements and prerequisites for those requirements;" and	85 86 87 88	
WHEREAS, upward educational mobility is best served by preserving standards which maintain and promote academic excellence; therefore,	90 91	
BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hunter College Senate as the duly constituted governance organization urges the Board of Trustees to reject any proposal which interferes with the right and responsibility of each CUNY College to set and maintain its own academic standards for degree candidates.	92 93 94 95

Prof. Sam Korn, Chairperson of the Charter Review Committee, presented the First Reading of the proposed amendments to the Hunter College Governance Charter, as distributed.	
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He informed the Senate that, in accordance with established rules, no vote would be taken at this meeting and that amendments may be proposed at the May 1 Senate meeting. Any suggestions for changes should be submitted to his Committee in writing as soon as possible.	100 101 102 103
He informed the Senate that in the revisions to eliminate sexist language, his committee had not come forward with a recommendation to change the term "Ombudsman," and that the Senate should express its preference.	104 105 106

Report by the President	108
President Shalala informed the Senate that parts of the CUNY budget are in terrible trouble in Albany. This was very unexpected. She urged everyone to put pressure on the Legislature in Albany by sending a nightletter telegram immediately to Senators Warren Anderson, John Marchi and Roy Goodman, as well as Mark Alan Siegel and Stanley Fink of the State Assembly, urging them to amend the Executive Budget as follows: (a) Restore the 127 teaching and support positions; (b) add lines for child care; (c) eliminate the proposed 10% cut in funds for temporary service.	109 110 111 112 113 114 115
