1. Read the following letter from President Wexler, dated October 9th, 1973, addressed to the Members of The Hunter College Senate:	10 11
"I welcome the opportunity of making a brief report at the beginning of Senate meetings. Unfortunately, I must attend a BHE committee meeting at 4 p.m. this afternoon followed by a BHE meeting. Professor Sherover and I agreed that I would send a brief written message when I was unable to attend.	12 13 14 15 16 17
I wish to appoint two administrative members of the Senate, Dean Dolciani, and Dean Seiger. They will fill seats vacated by me and by Dean Tesoriero. Dean Tesoriero will, of course, be available to the Senate at any time that the agenda concerns touch his area of responsibility.	18 19 20 21 22 23
For the first time in recent years, there is a noticeable release in space pressure at 695 Park Avenue. We are also convinced that the Hunter Midtown facility has begun well and we are pledged to continue to make the modifications necessary to make it work effectively. I have spent several hours a week at Hunter Midtown and will continue to do so for the balance of the year.	24 25 26 27 28 29 30
All activities presently housed in P.S. 76 and in the Welfare Building will be re-placed at 695 Park Avenue, 930 Lexington Avenue, or at Hunter Midtown before January 1, 1974. Both buildings are scheduled for demolition early in 1974 and excavation for the two new towers, one on that site, the other across Lexington Avenue on the parking lot site, will probably begin next spring or summer.
