She reported that Teacher Evaluation for the Fall 1971 semester had been completed and that copies of the print-outs had been distributed to all Departmental Teacher Evaluation Committees and the Reference Room in Library.

She informed the Senate that Teacher Evaluation for the Spring 1972 semester had been scheduled for May 1 through May 6.

Prof. Miriam Hecht (Mathematics) moved the following which was defeated:

"Insofar as the standard questionnaire prepared by the 90. Committee on the Evaluation of Teaching is in some cases 91. not applicable to innovative and experimental courses 92. now being given in the college, it is recommended that 93. departments offering such courses may, with the permission of the Committee, prepare their own questionnaires 95. to replace the core questions. 96.
