5	After discussion, Prof. Bennick, on behalf of the Nominating Committee, moved the following substitute motion:	44 45

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hunter College Senate is a continuous 46 body that may specify the term of service on its standing committees. 47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that when the Senate creates an ad-hoc 48 committee, it shall specify the expiration date of that commiteee. 49 If no expiration date is so specified, the committee shall expire 50 at the end of that academic year. 51 After discussion, the question was called and the motion to substitute 52 carried by hand vote with 33 in favor and 22 opposed. 53 The substitute motion (lines 46 to 51 above) carried by hand vote. 54 Undergraduate Academic Requirements Committee 55 Prof. Peter Basquin, Chairman of the Committee, presented the following 56 resolution: 57 RESOLVED, that, while the increased credit (3 credits) for remedial 58 courses remains in effect, all remedial courses other than 17 015, 59 17 002, 17 005, 48 001, 98 001, 99 023, 99 059, 99 032, 99 012, 60 99 165 (or their equivalents) will be graded on a credit/no-credit 61 basis only. Grades in these courses would not be counted under the present rule 62 which limits students to only one credit/no-credit grade for each 63 15 credits accumulated at Hunter, until they have successfully 64 completed 30 credits. 65 He then yielded the floor to Mr. Callender, who presented the Minority 66 Report as distributed, and moved for its approval as a substitute 67 motion. 68 After discussion, the question was called and carried on the motion to 69 substitute. 70 The motion to substitute was defeated by hand vote. 71 The motion on the floor was approval of the Committee's resolution. 72 Prof. Bennick moved that the resolution be amended by adding: 73 "This shall take effect in the Fall semester 1977." 74 This amendment was accepted by the mover and became part of the main 75 motion on the floor. 76 Prof. Matthews moved that the motion be amended by inserting the 77 following: 78 "...remains in effect, or until such time as computer facilities 79 enable us to separate out the remedial courses for index purposes, 80 at which time the situation will be evaluated, all other..." 81 During discussion it was requested that the Minutes reflect Mr. Temares' 82 statement that the computer will be programmed to do what the Senate 83 requests it to do. 84 After further discussion, Prof. Mirenda moved to recommit. 85 The motion to recommit was defeated by hand vote. 86 The question was called and carried on Prof. Matthews motion to amend. 87 The motion to amend was defeated by hand vote with 25 in favor and 88 30 opposed. 89 The motion on the floor is the Committee's resolution as amended by 90 Prof. Bennick. 91 The question was called and carried. 92

	The lacuna cited above stems from the fact that the By-laws of the Board require of the Chief Librarian, as the Chairman of that Department, to administer the policies of the latter as well as pertinent faculty policy. Hunter College does not have a duly constituted instrument for apprising the Chief Librarian of such policy. The Committee on Departmental Governance, on showing the inclination (see its superseded report to this session) of endeavoring to get this lacuna closed by moving the establishment of a Standing Committee on the Library, was firmly advised that this was beyond its scope of purview.
