Election of Election of Ombudsman 8
 Ombudsman: In accordance with the resolution of the Senate at its meeting on 9
 April 6th, mandating the first item of business as the election 10
 of Ombudsman, the Chairman turned the Chair over to the Vice- 11
 Chairman of the Senate, Mr. Neil Callender, who advised the body 12
 that Mr. Bob Daly, Chairman of the Elections Committee, would 13
 report on procedures. 14

Mr. Daly presented and explained the proposed "Voting Procedures 15
 for Election of Ombudsman," as distributed. 16

A motion to approve the proposed Rules of Procedure for the Election 17
 of the Ombudsman carried by voice vote. (see Appendix II attached) 18

Mr. Daly presented the alternatives which the present rules allow. 41


After discussion it was moved and voted that at the meeting on 42

A P P E N D I X I I

1. Five minutes are allotted to each candidate to make his own presentation in the following order:
 1. Savage
 2. Santoro
 3. Weyl
 4. Korn
 5. Sherover
2. The Chairman of the Elections Committee shall occupy the floor microphone, as any Committee Chairman delivering a report, and shall instruct and/or counsel with the Chair on procedural questions as they may arise. All questions about procedure from the floor shall be directed to him.
3. Appointed tellers will pass out the voting kit for Round #1:

5 of these cards are each marked with the name of one candidate; 1 card, to be used to record the presence of the individual voter, is marked "Attendance (salmon)".
4. Each Senator, in voting, will select: (i) the "Attendance (salmon)" card, and (ii) as many Candidate Card(s) as he wishes to have counted.
5. Each Senator will return the card(s) for the candidate(s) he is voting for with the "Attendance (salmon)" card on top. To cast a negative vote on all candidates, the Senator will return only the "Attendance (salmon)" card.
6. All returned cards will be fed into the card-counter. In announcing the results, they will be read as:
 - i. Total number of participating voters: _____
=total number of "Attendance (salmon)" cards
 - ii. Number of affirmative votes needed to win: _____
=(from Charter): number that "exceeds two-thirds of the number of representatives present and voting."
 - iii. Votes of each candidate, in card order.

If no candidate has achieved the requisite minimum, the presiding officer shall order Round # 2, following the same procedure as 3 and 4 above.

If two or more candidates achieve the requisite minimum, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared the winner.

If two or more candidates achieve the requisite minimum with a tie-vote, the presiding officer shall order Round #2, following the same procedure as 3 and 4 above.
7. In the event that no result has been achieved by 6:15 p.m., the presiding officer shall consult the body concerning its wishes as to continuing (in which case the motion *MUST* include a terminal time), or postponing further voting (either: a. after the elections of officers at the meeting on May 18th, or b. till early in the fall).
8. In the event that an earlier result is achieved, the presiding officer will turn over the Chair to the Chairman of the Senate so that regular business may proceed.
