Below is a summary of President Raab's report:

"Good afternoon. I know you have a long agenda and Tom asked me to come today and speak on the current budget issues. I wanted to start with recent changes that have been in the news. There have been some significant leadership changes in the central office at CUNY. In April, the long-serving Chief Operating Officer retired and was not replaced, and last week before Thanksgiving the long-serving General Counsel announced his retirement at the end of this month. We just found out earlier this week that the long-term Vice Chancellor for External Relations and Secretary to the Board of Trustees has stepped down from his potion at CUNY Central and will return to his home campus of Queens College. I cannot say if the position will be replaced or if the Central Office organizational structure will change.

I also want to follow up on the New York State Inspector General's report and the implication for our campus. Soon after the announcement of the resignation of the City College President, the Chairman of the CUNY Board asked the State Inspector General to investigate how the various college foundations raised and used money. This was an unusual type of request as it was focused on CUNY college foundations which are independent 501 (c)3 organizations. They are governed by the Attorney General. Part of the issue with the investigation was the use of private money to support compensation packages for college presidents. The letter that was sent to the Inspector General asked to look at the presidents' use of money and the designation and authority from the central office to the presidents. The investigation has been ongoing, and it was determined that five campuses in each borough would be randomly selected and reviewed by the Inspector General. City College was on the list, and Hunter was added, making it two colleges from Manhattan, and one from the other four boroughs. We have been under a review pursuant to the Board of Trustees request, and the review which started with the foundation has changed to a college-wide review. There have been questions asked about who has state credit cards and how we manage and spend our funds.

One item that they reported and flagged us on was the money that we have devoted to lobbyists. When they looked at the reports, it did not look like they were providing decent service for the amount that we have paid the firms. We are in the process of trying to explain why that is. The reason is that if someone is a registered lobbyist, he or she has to report on a sheet every conversation they have with governmental and elected officials. They do more than this, however, but that is all they have to report. They do more than this for example during the period when we were getting our 74th Street project approved and we had to get out there to get the community board approval. These are the type of things that the firms help us with.

I just want to say that the College Foundation does a lot for the campus. While we have taken budget cuts over the past few years, the money donated has gone to support the campus community directly. The library renovations, student scholarships, and event support comes from it."

"At the last meeting, the Administrative Committee introduced the following resolution. I will read the resolution into the record again and then it belongs to the body be debated, amended or adopted as it."

Resolution to Establish an Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures

Be it resolved that the Senate Administrative Committee establish an Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures, including those units officially named Programs, Institutes, Centers, Schools, or any other non-departmental or interdepartmental entities offering or managing courses of study in any capacity.

Be it further resolved that this Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures include the following members (all with vote): one full-time faculty member from each Division of the School of Arts and Sciences, one full-time faculty member from the School of Education, one full-time faculty member from the School of Social Work, one full-time faculty member from the Division that includes the School of Nursing and Health Professions and Urban Public Health, one at-large full-time faculty member from the School of Arts and Sciences, one additional full-time faculty member affiliated with an interdisciplinary program, two undergraduate students (one of whom shall be from an honors program), and one graduate student.

The committee shall also include the following members who will serve with voice but without vote: the Chair of the Senate Departmental Governance Committee (or designee), the Chair of the Undergraduate Course of Study Committee (or designee), The Provost (or designee), and the Dean of Arts and Sciences (or designee).

Be it further resolved that the Senate Nominating Committee will accept nominations from any current Senator, the list to be shared with the Senate Administrative Committee who will share the list with the Senate as a whole and any other relevant bodies. Candidates may also self-nominate.

Be it further resolved that this Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures is charged with (A) researching the current structures and practices pertaining to governance of such units at Hunter College, (B) consulting and coordinating with any related Presidential or administrative task force and with relevant administrative offices, (C) consulting and coordinating with all relevant Senate committees, including the Undergraduate Course of Study Committee, the Graduate Course of Study and Academic Requirements Committee, and the Committee on Honors, and (D) reporting to the Senate and making recommendations for Senate action concerning the following with regard to Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures: the nature of governance and representation, pathways for curricular development, issues related to coordination between such units and departments and other offices at the college, and any other issues related to governance.

Be it finally resolved that this Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures communicate with the Senate Charter Review Committee to make recommendations for Senate action when and where those actions require revision of The Charter for the Governance of Hunter College.

Be it further resolved that this Ad-hoc Senate Committee on the Governance of Programs and Interdisciplinary Structures include the following members (all with vote): one full-time faculty member from each Division of the School of Arts and Sciences, one full-time faculty member from the School of Education, one full-time faculty member from the School of Social Work, one full-time faculty member from the Division that includes the School of Nursing and Health Professions and Urban Public Health, one at-large full-time faculty member from the School of Arts and Sciences, one additional full-time faculty member affiliated with an interdisciplinary program, two undergraduate students (one of whom shall be from an honors program), and—one graduate students. The Provost (or designee), and the Dean of Arts and Sciences (or designee) Dean from an additional school determined by the Provost. The committee shall also include the following members who will serve with voice but without vote: the Chair of the Senate Departmental Governance Committee (or designee), the Chair of the Undergraduate Course of Study Committee (or designee), The Provost (or designee), and the Dean of Arts and Sciences (or designee).

After lengthy discussion and debate, the question was called and carried with 2 opposed and 1 abstention.

Voting by clicker produced the following results: 57 in favor, 21 against, and 3 abstentions.
