26 27		WHEREAS, the Charter for a Governance of Hunter College states that:
28 29		<ul> <li>the Senate shall have policy-making powers in the following areas:</li> <li>A. Curriculum and related education matters.</li> </ul>
30		B. Academic requirements and standards of academic standing.
31 32		C. College development, review and forward planning of facilities, staff, and fiscal requirements (Article II, Section 1)
33 34		• the Senate shall have the right to express itself formally as an advisory body in any area its considers important, and to transmit its recommendations to the appropriate authorities (Article II,
35		Section 2)
36 37		• the Committee on the Budget "will review the resulting consolidated annual budget of the College and report on it to the Senate" (Article VIII, Section 9); and
38		WHEREAS, it is at times unavoidable to increase tuition and/or fees to preserve the academic
39		integrity of the college and/or one of its units; therefore,
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41		BE IT RESOLVED, that all plans for tuition increases, fee increases, or new fees, in
42		excess of \$50 per student per semester originating at the college be submitted to the
43		Senate for careful deliberation in its Committee on the Budget and a subsequent vote
44		in the full Senate to either recommend or not recommend such a plan, and that the
45		recommendation by the Hunter Senate be included with any such proposal for a
46		tuition/fee increase submitted to the CUNY Board of Trustees.

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### **Appendix: Procedural Principles**

In dealing with proposals for tuition or fee increases the Senate shall adhere to the following procedural principles:

1. Proposals and supporting documentation (including but not limited to budgetary analysis, need assessment, and recommendations by governing bodies in the affected unit(s) are to be submitted to the Senate Office which will refer the matter to the Committee on the Budget. Proposals should be submitted not later than four weeks prior to the last scheduled Senate meeting in an academic term.

2. The Committee on the Budget will schedule a meeting to discuss and review the proposal within two weeks after receipt of the proposal. The dean(s) of the affected school(s) and the head(s) of affected units (programs) as well as student representatives from the affected school(s)/unit(s) shall be invited to this meeting and be given an opportunity to present their view. (The Provost and VP for Finance & Administration are ex officio members of the Committee on the Budget.)

3. The Committee on the Budget shall prepare a resolution for the full Senate in time for a Senate meeting not later than four weeks after submission of the proposal.

4. Failure to act within these time limits by either the Committee on the Budget or the full Senate should be considered as recommendation of the proposal. -

5. If the Committee on the Budget and the Senate withhold a recommendation for a proposed tuition/fee increase for reason of insufficient documentation, this reason shall be included with the proposal for a tuition/fee increase submitted to the CUNY Board of Trustees.

After discussion the question was called and carried. The resolution was approved by voice vote..
