**Minutes** Page 5272 **Meeting of the Hunter College Senate** 15 March 2006 WHEREAS, no clear evidence has been presented indicating that turnstiles are the best possible means for enhancing the security of the campus and the safety of members of the Hunter College community, WHEREAS, there is widespread, reasonable, and deeply felt opposition among members of the Hunter College community to the installation of turnstiles, and WHEREAS, the best interests of Hunter College are served if major changes in mechanisms for achieving the security and safety of its members are supported by a college consensus; therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Administrative Committee of the Senate establish an ad-hoc committee representing a diverse range of views at the college concerning campus safety and security to advise Vice-President Zinnanti about the best means for achieving these goals, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that major new mechanisms for achieving campus safety and security recommended by Vice-President Zinnanti, including any turnstile system, be approved by the Senate before going into effect." After discussion, voting by clickers produced the following results: 72 in favor, 48 opposed, 5 abstentions. The motion failed to receive the required number of 102 votes.
