65			structional staff, members of the administration, and students.			
66		2.	Form of complaints Complaints may be made orally or via a written mechanism (includ			
67		2.	ing email). Complaints may be received directly from the aggrieved party/parties or from a			
68			third party who believes that they observed a breach of an individual's or group's academic			
69			freedom rights. Any member of the Academic Freedom Committee may accept a complain			
70			after which it shall be passed to the Chair of the Committee.			
71		3.	Initial inquiry An informal 'fact finding' inquiry shall be initiated by the Chair of the			
72		٥.	Committee. It is the Chair's responsibility to determine the merits of the complaint, and i			
73			the complaint involves issues of academic freedom. If the Chair determines that the
