2 The 426<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Hunter College Senate was convened at 4:10 PM in Room W714.  
3  
4 **Presiding:** Alan Hausman, Chair

6 **Attendance:** The elected members of the Senate with the exception of those listed in Appendix I.

17 **Committee:** The Chair presented the report as follows:  
18 **Approved Curriculum Changes**  
19 The following curriculum changes, as listed in Part I and Part II of the report dated April 15, 2003, were approved  
20 as per Senate resolution and were submitted for the Senate information: Items US-1295 and US-1296 (School of  
21 Nursing), UE-1299A (Philosophy), UE-1301 ((Psychology/Women's Studies), UE-1302 (Sociology), UE-1303  
22 (Political Science), UE-1304 (Romance Languages), UE-1309 (Music), UE-1310 (Economics), UE-1312  
23 (German), GS-576, GS-577, and GS-580 (Special Education), GS-581 (Curriculum & Teaching), GS-582  
24 (Theatre), GS-583 (School of Nursing), and GS-584 (Education).  
25 **Special Election to fill vacant seats on the Senate**  
26 The Chair presented the following nominations for seats reserved for students:  
27 Rose Virginia Lara (Political Science), Ashley Mullin (Political Science)

29 It was moved that the nominations be approved. The motion carried.

31 **Other Reports:** **Resolution Re: Budget Cuts**  
32 The following resolution was on the floor:

34 BE IT RESOLVED that the Hunter College Senate oppose the cut in base funding to the City University of  
35 \$81.7 million, as well as the proposed cut in funding of the Tuition Assistance Program, the proposed cut in  
36 funding for the SEEK Program, proposed cuts to new faculty funding and the proposed cuts in funding for  
37 childcare in the budget for the Department of Family Assistance in the proposed 2003-2004 Executive  
38 Budget, and  
39  
40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hunter College Senate call for adequate funding of the City  
41 University in the 2003-2004 New York State Budget, and  
42  
43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hunter College Senate support and encourage the efforts of  
44 members of the Hunter College community to assure the enactment of State and City budgets adequate to  
45 meet the needs of Hunter College and the entire City University of New York.

47 After discussion the question was called and carried.

49 The resolution was approved by voice vote.  
50  
51 It was moved that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 4:35 PM.
