After discussion, Prof. Mader moved the following substitute motion: 44 "that the Calendar Committee be established as a Standing Committee 45 of the Senate with equal sessional representation." The question was called and carried. 47 The substitute motion carried by hand vote with 4 abstentions. 48 It was agreed that the Administrative Committee make a recommendation 49 to the Senate regarding the structure of the Standing Committee on the 50 Calendar. 51 Departmental Governance Committee 52 Dean Walter Weiss, Chairperson of the Committee, presented the Report 53 dated 10 April 1979, and moved for approval of the Revised By-laws of 54 the Philosophy Department. 55 After discussion the question was called and carried. 56 The motion to approve the revised By-Laws of the Philosophy Department 57 carried by hand vote. APPENDIX II

REVISED BY-LAWS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY:

- I. Membership, Voting Rights, and Eligibility to Hold Office
 - I. Both tenured and non-tenured full-time faculty member shall have full voting rights in the control of the educational policies of the department as specified by the By-Laws of Board of Higher Education, Article IX, Section 9.1, of January, 1973, (hereinafter referred to as the BHE By-Laws).
 - Voting and eligibility to serve in the following cases are as prescribed and mandated by the BHE By-Laws; and by the Charter of the Governance at Hunter College of September 1970 (hereinafter referred to as the Charter).
 - a. Elections of Chairman and members of Personnel & Budget Committee.
 - b. Election of departmental representatives to the Hunter College Senate.
 - c. Election of departmental representatives to the Evening : Session Council.
 - 3. A faculty member of the Divisional Committee on Curriculum shall be elected for the following year by faculty voting members at the last meeting of the department in the academic year. A student member shall be elected by the student membership of the Departmental Policy and Governance Committee.

II. Officers

- 1. The elected officers of the department shall be
 - a. The Chairman
 - b. The Secretary-Treasurer
- 2. The appointed officers of the department shall be
 - a. The evening session representative
 - b. The day session advisor
- 3. Duties and powers of the Chairman are those given in the BHE By-Laws Article IX, Section 9.3
- 4. Duties and Powers of the Secretary Treasurer shall be as determined by voting faculty members, provided these do not conflict with the duties and powers of the Chairman as prescribed by the BHE By-Laws.

III. Personnel and Budget Committee

- 1. Membership conditions, duties and powers are as laid down in the BHE By-Laws, Article IX, Section 9.1.
- IV. Selection of Members of Standing Committees
 - 1. Faculty members of Standing Committees are to be nominated by the Chairman from among both full-time and part-time teachers in the Department. At the first departmental meeting in the fall, the full-time faculty shall vote on these nominations.
 - 2. Student members of Standing Committees shall be selected from among philosophy majors and students enrolled in courses numbered 200 or above through a call for volunteers issued by the Chairman during the first month of the Fall term. If there are too many volunteers, the Chairman shall arrange for an election in which all philosophy majors and students enrolled in courses numbered 200 or above shall be eligible to vote.

APPENDIX III

Report by the Senate Advisory Committee on the Library, as amended and approved:

WHEREAS, the Library has been experiencing great difficulties because of severe budgetary cutbacks so that purchasing has been hard to achieve, and

WHEREAS, a significant amount of volumes have been removed from general use through longterm retention by individual members of the faculty; THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, that Faculty Library privileges be revised in the following manner:

- 1. Faculty members may borrow Library materials for a period of one month with the option of a one month extension arranged before the expiration date.
- 2. Faculty members who have not returned borrowed volumes or arranged for a loan extension on or before the expiration date are subject to the same monetary fine structure imposed upon students:
- 3. If individual faculty members fail to pay the fines due and/or to return the volumes, the Library is instructed to revoke their borrowing privileges until the fines have been paid and books have been returned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Administrative Committee explore the possibility of withholding the final salary check of faculty members who are severing their ties to the College until an official clearance from the Library has been secured and filed with that faculty member's Department.
