Mr. Ron Rizzuto moved "that the 'Proposal on Curriculum Revision' (originally submitted under New Business at the Senate Meeting on March 12, 1974) be referred to the Undergraduate Course of Study Committee, and that an interim report be given at the Senate meeting on May 7th, and if possible at the overflow meeting on April 30, 1974."

She pointed out that the November date is not a delaying process, but if we want to hear from the student majors, students involved in social groups, faculty, administration, etc., her Committee must have the time to have these hearings. It is not feasible to have a final report in by May 7th, and such report could only be a progress report because if hearings are to be held at all, they must be structured and scheduled.
